Your teams’ participation makes it possible for these women to produce and sell beeswax candles, honey- flavored baked goods, healing salves, bee pollen, hand and facial creams and more. Building beehive frames also builds teamwork, camaraderie and cooperation, and brings teams together for a great cause!

Best of all, at the end of the day, your teams have had a great time while making a meaningful contribution to a community in need. This really is one event where everybody wins.

PROGRAM LENGTH:

Approximately 2 - 3 hours

GROUP SIZE:

20 - 200+

TEAM SIZE:

8 - 10 people per team
